In 2010, the Riverside County Deputy District Attorney Association (RCDDAA) established a Charitable Arm tasked with granting monies to underfunded community organizations serving the children of Riverside County. We understand that our commitment to our community extends beyond the courtroom door. We challenge ourselves to provide tools that help our educators and community groups through these challenging times efficiently and with the greatest impact. In 2016, basic needs will take priority.

Who is eligible for assistance?

Grants will be made only to nonprofit organizations with tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service code, or who have a sponsoring agency with this status; a school; or public agency. All recipients must serve the children of Riverside County.

What is not funded through the RCDDAA Grants program?

- Individuals
- to fund research
- fundraising organizations or events
- programs that promote or engage in religious or political doctrine
- organizations outside Riverside County

How much money is available to our organization through the RCDDAA Grants Program?

Grants range in size from \$100 to \$5,000 and are made on a one-time basis, non-renewable, and non-transferable.

How will recipients be selected?

Our Charitable Giving Committee will assess applications as they are received. The committee is comprised of one member from each branch location in the county—Southwest, Riverside, and Indio.

How will the money be disbursed?

If your organization is selected as a recipient, you will be contacted by our Committee. A public presentation will be made to your organization, wherein the full sum will be disbursed.

RCDDAA awarded the following organizations with grant money in 2014:

Inland Empire Future Leaders Program--\$1,000

To host a leadership development summer camp for Latino 8th and 9th grade students

Safe Alternatives for Everyone--\$2,500

To provide school supplies, snacks and emergency assistance to youth in the Police Activity League

Edward Hyatt Elementary--\$500

To purchase books for the school library and to modernize the library facility

Monte Vista Middle School--\$500

To implement the Positive Behaviors Intervention and Support program which seeks to reward positive behaviors while re-teaching behavioral areas of concern

Kindling Intellectual Development (KID)--\$1,500

To sponsor under resourced youth at a summer day camp which exposes them to scientific and artistic projects that teach character development and leadership.

Mission Bell Elementary School & Sky County Elementary School --\$2,500 each

To replace the 50 year old playground equipment that nearly 500 students access each day

Rubidoux High School--\$500

To purchase books for the school library. The school has not had the funds to purchase books in 8 years

Simple Acts of Care & Kindness, Inc.--\$2,500

To sponsor the World Kindness Youth Conference for 4th grade students in the Corona/Norco School District which teaches them to cope effectively with bullying situations

CASA for Riverside County, Inc.--\$2,500

To increase mentor staff for the *Fostering Futures* program which develops transition plans for foster youths ages 14-21

Raymond Cree Robotic Club--\$500

To purchase base kits and expand the engineering program for this Middle School Robotic Club

Martha's Village and Kitchen--\$1000

To purchase classroom furniture and developmental toys for the infant and toddler classrooms for the Children Services program located onsite.

Palm Canyon Theater--\$750

To sponsor one student's scholarship to 6-week summer theater camp.

Van Buren Elementary School--\$500

To purchase board games and equipment for group play during recess in order to promote sportsmanship and positive student interactions.

Palm Springs Unified School District--\$500

Towards purchase of bus passes for students with attendance problems because of transportation issues.

Christopher's Clubhouse--\$500

To provide safety education to financially disadvantaged children and families in the Coachella Valley that will teach children and their parents how to avoid and if necessary, escape dangerous situations.

About Families--\$500

Towards scholarships for proactive parenting classes.

Palm Desert High School Robotics--\$500

Towards registration for two Botball tournaments and a First Tech Challenge.

La Quinta High School Robotics--\$500

Towards purchase of a Botball kit to start up the Robotics Club.

Rio Vista Elementary School 3rd Grade--\$450

To enrich creative capabilities and confidence in students through art projects.

Indio High School Cross Country--\$250

Towards transportation and race fees for the runners, team gear and equipment for the program.

La Quinta High School Girls' Basketball--\$250

Towards purchase of new uniforms for the team.
