WHERE DID THE MONEY GO?

We raised more than \$25,000.00 at our second Charity Golf Tournament. We were able to provide monetary grants to numerous county organizations that were in desperate need of funding:

Inland Empire Future Leaders Program--\$1,000

To host a leadership development summer camp for Latino 8th and 9th grade students

Safe Alternatives for Everyone--\$2,500

To provide school supplies, snacks and emergency assistance to youth in the Police Activity League

Edward Hyatt Elementary--\$500

To purchase books for the school library and to modernize the library facility

Monte Vista Middle School—\$500

To implement the Positive Behaviors Intervention and Support program which seeks to reward positive behaviors while re-teaching behavioral areas of concern

Kindling Intellectual Development (KID)--\$1,500

To sponsor under resourced youth at a summer day camp which exposes them to scientific and artistic projects that teach character development and leadership.

Mission Bell Elementary School—\$2,500

To replace the 50 year old playground equipment that nearly 500 students access each day

Sky County Elementary School --\$2,500

To replace the playground equipment accessed by 535 students each day, and to purchase megaphones for disaster/emergency situations.

Rubidoux High School--\$500

To purchase books for the school library. The school has not had the funds to purchase books in 8 years

To purchase base kits and expand the engineering program for this Middle School Robotic Club
